Dear Parents and Carers,

### Learning as the Focus

It's hard to believe we're approaching the midpoint of Term 4! While time appears to be flying by, great learning continues to happen in and out of our classrooms across the school. I've been happy to see a continued focus by our teachers to provide high quality learning opportunities for students within a safe learning environment. My sense of students achieving in their learning has been reinforced by the growth of our students as indicated in NAPLAN results, by talking to them about their learning achievements and through outlining our progress towards our Annual Plan priorities at our recent executive planning day. I will look to share some of this information with you before the end of this year and early next year.

### New Families and Staff for 2020

It's been lovely to meet families who are joining the Harrison School community in 2020, at our recent information sessions and to give new students an opportunity to get a feel for the school and start making friendships during our orientation sessions. While welcoming new families has been happening, Dan, Jacqui and I have been busy identifying new staff for 2020. We are getting closer to finalising this and will share the names of staff transferring to different schools along with the names of those joining us with you shortly.

### Changes to School Entries

Later in this edition of the newsletter, you'll see photos of the changes made to the main entrance recently with information about the reasons for it. We have collaborated with the Education Directorate to alter both the main entrance and the 7-10 entrance to provide better supervision of who is entering and leaving the school during the school day. While the gates at the main entrance are a little unsightly (we'll work on 'softening' their look), both these and the redesign of the 7-10 entrance and office essentially provide increased safety for our students.

## **Student Absences**

As I mentioned in the week one newsletter for this term, we are implementing a new attendance monitoring system for students. With the system, parents/carers will still receive an SMS message for each child absent, generally by 10:30am.

This is a reminder to ask you to now reply directly to the SMS when providing a reason for the absence (although you are more than welcome to call to check on any absence/late notification you have questions about). When replying to the SMS, please provide:

- A reason for your child's absence/late arrival
- Information about the expected length of absence
- Whether the absence/late arrival is approved by you or not

To help us in maintaining accurate and efficient administration, we ask that you reply separately to each absence notification you receive (this allows us to make the most of automated features in the system). When replying, it's worth remembering that what you write is exactly what is saved in the school records, it isn't edited and reworded before being stored.

As well as the use of language in different countries and the significance of some important historical sites, the students learned a lot from this experience about themselves, travelling, opportunities, culture, and much, much more.

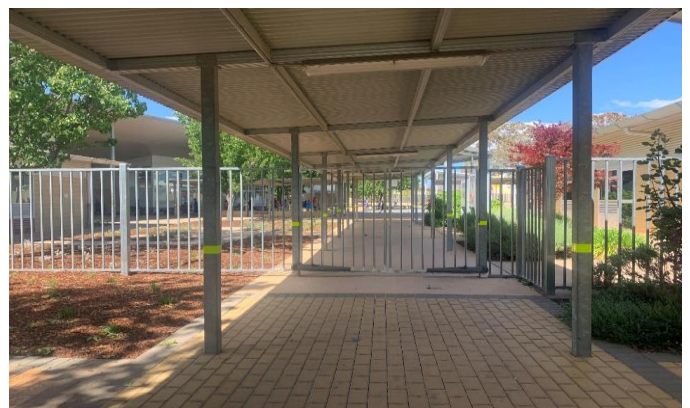


## IMPORTANT INFORMATION - CHANGES TO ENTRANCE ON WIMMERA STREET

As you may have already noticed, new fences have been installed surrounding the main Wimmera Street entrance into the school. These fences have been installed to improve student safety. The gates will be locked between 9:30am – 2:30pm.

All people entering the school grounds during these hours will be required to enter through the sliding doors leading into the front office, then pass through the new automatic door. A release button has also been installed and the administration staff will activate the door for anyone exiting the school. We are currently planning for an artwork or display to be incorporated into the fence to encourage a more welcoming approach.

Harrison School is moving to a new report template this semester to contribute to greater consistency of reporting across all ACT Public schools. The new

report format uses the Achievement Standards directly from the Australian Curriculum, as opposed to the school generated outcomes based on these.

We will be utilising the new report template and the new School Administration System to distribute all Semester 2 reports this term.

One of the major changes of this system is that all reports for this semester will be emailed home. It is therefore important that the school has a current email address.

For families who require a second report, these reports will be printed and sent home with students unless we receive an email with confirmation of an email address for these reports.

### HARRISON SCHOOL BOARD

The Harrison School Board held its regular meeting on 5 November 2019 to review the school's performance, priorities and current issues. The Board welcomed the new parent representative, Mr Mike Burns. Members were provided with a report from the Principal on school operational matters, as well as an update on the school's current financial position. Members also received reports from the staff and student representatives on the many events and activities that students and staff have been involved with recently, as well as upcoming events. The Parents and Citizens Association (P&C) President reported on recent and upcoming activities and requested consideration of future planning needs for school facilities run by the P&C including the senior canteen and uniform shop. The Board also discussed the school's NAPLAN progress against benchmarks, and the draft 2020 school budget. A review of current school policies and procedures was flagged for action by Members in 2020. The next Board meeting has been tentatively scheduled for February 25, 2020.
