Dear Parents and Carers,

What a term! When you consider what the year started like with bushfires and air quality monitoring and now with the impact of Coronavirus, we are certainly having our capacity to adapt and be resilient tested. I've been extremely grateful of how you, our parent community, have responded. You have been calm and considered with your questions and decision making, thinking about the well-being of our community and your own family. Our staff continue to be appreciative of your support as their profession has been turned on its head. They have been busy learning new skills, planning in different ways and preparing a range of learning options for their students - it's been very impressive to watch.

We are still awaiting advice about what Term 2 will look like in relation to student attendance at school. We will communicate this information to families as soon as we know.

This week we are trialling the new online learning platforms across the school. While the experience will be quite different, I hope you enjoy engaging in it and helping your children with their learning. ## BASE REPORTS

'BASE Reports' (previously known as PIPS reports) were due to be issued this week, however due to the global issues caused by COVID-19, the Education Directorate (ED) is yet to receive the dataset needed to produce these reports. As soon as it is received, the ED will endeavour to quality assure the data and provide feedback to schools for distribution.

## READ AND WRITE FOR GOOGLE

Read and Write for Google (RW4G) is an assistive technology tool that supports students when undertaking reading, writing and research. It can be used by students both at school and in the home. It can be installed as a Google Chrome Extension from the Chrome Web Store. The ED is offering workshops for parents to develop their understanding of the tool to enable them to support their child/ren's use of the tool within the home.

The first workshop will be held on 7 May 2020 and the workshop will run again on 25 August 2020.

## COVID-19 TRANSLATED RESOURCES

## ALUMINIUM COMPOSITE PANELS (ACP)

In 2017, the ACT Government commenced an audit of Government owned buildings for cladding materials consisting of either Aluminium Composite Panels (ACP) or Expanded Polystyrene (EPS).

Both of these cladding types are potentially combustible and, in the case of a fire, can increase the likelihood of a fire spreading more quickly.

The audit was conducted by a team from Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) who undertook visual assessments of government owned buildings and found that some buildings may have potentially combustible ACP or EPS, including a number of ACT public schools.

Experts from the Environment, Planning, Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) have assessed that all of these buildings are safe to occupy.

Some of our school buildings have been found to contain some Aluminium Composite Panels (ACP).

It is important to note that the presence of ACP cladding does not necessarily mean that there is an increased fire risk to your school community.

There are four types of ACP and a more comprehensive assessment is required to determine which type your school has. This work will soon be undertaken by qualified Fire Engineers to assess the fire risk these materials may pose.

As the comprehensive assessment is undertaken, we will be advised of the type and location of the potentially combustible cladding and we will work with the assessment team on plans to mitigate any risk through management strategies or removal of the material.

## NAPLAN



On March 20, 2020 the Education Council announced that NAPLAN testing will not proceed in 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Not proceeding will greatly assist our schools and our teachers to focus wholly on educating our students in this challenging time. The measures in place to combat the spread of COVID-19 would have impacted on participation rates, the delivery of tests, and the validity of NAPLAN data.

## PUBLIC HOLIDAY DATE 2020

Monday 27 April 2020 is declared a public holiday.

This year, ANZAC day falls on Saturday 25 April 2020 and consequently, Monday 27 April 2020 has been declared a public holiday. This is in addition to the ANZAC Day public holiday on Saturday 25 April 2020.


The Term 2, 2020 dates information on the ED website and the Public Holiday information on ACT Government website has been updated to reflect the public holiday. Term 2, 2020 starts on Tuesday 28 April.
