Excursion Information:

As part of our Learning Community's HASS focus of History studying Australia's colonial past we have arranged an excursion to the National Museum of Australia.

The Wild Colonial Bag onsite program is tailored for teachers leading self-guided student groups and includes objects and activities for exploring the Museum. The activities support the Australian Curriculum, suit different learning styles and lets students explore migrant experiences, the impacts of colonialism, the age of paddle-steamers and much more.

The excursion relates directly to several of the curriculum indicators we are covering this semester, including:

- The impact of a significant <u>development</u> or event on an Australian colony (ACHASSK108)
- The nature of convict or colonial presence, including the factors that influenced patterns of development, aspects of the daily life of the inhabitants (including Aboriginal Peoples and Torres Strait Islander Peoples) and how the <u>environment</u> changed (ACHASSK107)

Staff accompanying students on excursions will take all reasonable care while the students are in their charge to protect them from injury and to control and supervise their behaviour and activities.

I authorise the teacher in charge of this excursion to make arrangements for the welfare of my child, including medical or surgical treatment in an emergency. I also agree to meet the costs associated with any emergency arrangement.

I agree that my child will be under the authority of the school for the duration of the excursion, and that the teacher in charge is authorised to return the student home at the expense of the parent/carer if the teacher in charge considers that circumstances warrant such action.

Parents should be aware that staff members are not responsible for injuries or damage to property which may occur on an excursion where, in all circumstances, staff have not been negligent. Parents should warn children of the risk to themselves, to others and to property, of impulsive, wilful or disobedient behaviour.
