Dear Parents and Carers,

We've almost made it! As Term 4 has wrapped up, I've been reflecting on our challenges and achievements across 2019. There has been terrific learning occurring in classrooms throughout the year and with our focus on improving the literacy skills of students, we have seen significant progress in our reading, writing, spelling and grammar for different year levels across the school. We've seen some great growth in students through NAPLAN results, Progressive Achievement Test (<https://www.acer.org/au/pat>) data, ongoing class assessments and semester reports. Students have also had opportunities for social, emotional and academic growth through structured play activities, targeted cybersafety and social/emotional well-being learning and a range of carnivals and excursions.

Term 4 itself has been both frenetic and terrific. Last week, we celebrated two major events in the form of our Year 10 Graduation and Formal and, our ACE Awards evening. The Year 10 students looked spectacular in their formal wear and I was filled with pride to see the smiles on the faces of students and parents as the Year 10 Portfolios were awarded. Our ACE Awards ceremonies were also fantastic - in all, we presented approximately 475 awards to students as recognition of their achievements and efforts. Again, it was delightful to see the smiles and pride on the faces of students and parents as awards were presented. In addition to this, when these sorts of events occur, I am regularly amazed at how well our student leaders step up to the occasion - in the last two years, we have invested time into the development of our student leadership program, and we are seeing the benefits. I am filled with excitement about the potential in our 2020 student leaders and the possibilities this group will have. Yr. 7-10 STEM 2019 Wrap Up

2019 has been a big year for the new STEM learning area in the senior school. We have welcomed some new staff to a new learning area. We have developed some new curriculum and have moved forward with a focus on developing student inquiry skills through problem-based learning whilst maintaining high quality explicit teaching. We have extended students through a range of enrichment activities including sending teams to the Gungahlin College STEM Challenge, Burgmann College Maths Challenge Day and our Harrison STEM Day for National Science Week. Our STEM day saw over 50 students compete in house teams on a range of problem-based learning challenges where students needed to bring

cooperative teamwork skills with their critical and complex reasoning skills to apply STEM knowledge to complete the challenge. A group of year 10 girls attended the Women in STEM presentation at St Clare's College where they heard from a range of female industry leaders, enriching our lives through their application of STEM.

We have had 3 students, Peter Vermeulen, Aarv Saini and Shaarik Mohamed Sharief successfully complete the inaugural ACT Science Mentor's program, studying stars at the Mt Stromlo observatory. We're pleased to announce that Advait Ramakrishnan is one of 20 students selected from over 200, 000 students for the Mathspace Transformative 20 award for 2019. Advait has been selected based on a range of criteria which include purpose, growth, and dedication to their learning as well as the learning of others. I would like to thank all the STEM students and their dedicated teachers for their enthusiasm and dedication this year. We look forward to building on this in 2020 with the introduction of our Year 9 Integrated STEM course and enhancing learning for all students.

One of our year 4 students has made the decision to donate her hair. Here, in her words, is her story.


"Hello, my name is Sophia and I am 10 years old. I have made the decision to make a difference by cutting and donating my hair to be made into a wig for someone who has lost their hair due to a medical condition. I have let my hair grow all my life, cut only once a couple of centimetres because I like it. But this time I will cut 40cm to donate it.

Although my family has never been touched by cancer, I saw the brother of my cousin's friend, who had lost his hair because of the treatment he received.

Because of that, I thought, "How can I help?" Then, I found out about Hair with Heart and decided "Maybe I can help this way". I love my hair but I hope that by cutting it and giving it away, I can help make a difference.

Did you know wigs cost families up to \$6,000 and last only 1-2 years, meaning families can spend tens of thousands of dollars on the purchase of wigs throughout a child's youth.

By making a donation on my page you can help provide a wig or other vital equipment to a child in need.

I'll be chopping 40 cm of my hair off on December 17, 2019. Please help me make a difference. THANK YOU FOR HELPING KIDS IN NEED. 

Sophia has already raised \$1170 towards her target of \$3000.

If you'd like to and can donate, here's her link. What a generous thing for a 10 year old to do and what an impact she's making. I'd love us to help her get to her goal. Not all of us are blessed with good health.
