Parents are Critical Partners in Knowing Each Learner

Recently, I've been rereading Lyn Sharratt's book, *CLARITY, What Matters Most in Learning, Teaching, and Leading*.

From her book, Lyn states;

Parents are student's first teachers and can be hugely influential players in the learning for, with and beside each student. As Pam Betts reminds us, "parents and the broader community are important stakeholders, with parents and caregivers having roles critical to their children's success. More often than not, they don't know the questions to ask their children or ask the teachers when they want to know more about how their child is doing in school. So, we give them a script"

5 QUESTIONS PARENTS CAN ASK TEACHERS

1. What is my child learning?
2. How is she or he doing?
3. How do you know (how she or he is doing)?
4. How can she or he improve?
5. What supports can I provide, and can you provide if she or he is struggling? When will we check in again?

Equity and Excellence

The concept of equity was a feature of the Future of Education conversations that occurred last year and

helped shape the priorities of the Education Directorate Strategic Plan (<https://www.education.act.gov.au/our-priorities/strategic-plan>). During a recent leadership forum, we had a focus on the topic of equity and excellence in ACT Education and it was great to be part of a rich conversation about giving every student the opportunity to be successful in their learning and achieve positive outcomes. A quote from Mary Jean Gallagher, "Set high standards for everyone and build ramps for those who may have barriers to achieving those standards" really resonated with me and set the scene for the conversation.

One of the themes that came through strongly was the importance of relationships and as I reflected on our school, I appreciated that despite our large community, one of our priorities continues to be building positive and productive relationships. Another theme central to equity in education is fairness. Essentially this relates to the concept of students and families getting what they need to be successful rather than everyone getting the same thing. Through getting to know students and families, differentiating learning, acknowledging cultural and social differences and offering supports where needed, we strive to achieve this at Harrison. While I'd struggle to say we get this right all the time, the intent is certainly there and sometimes we need to learn how to meet student and family needs; doing this in partnership is when we achieve success.

HARRISON SCHOOL STUDENT REPORT CHANGES

Harrison School is moving to a new report template this semester to contribute to greater consistency of reporting across all ACT Public schools. The new report format uses the Achievement Standards directly from the Australian Curriculum, as opposed to the school generated outcomes based on these.

We will be utilising the new report template and the new School Administration System to distribute all Semester 2 reports this term.

One of the major changes of this system is that all reports for this semester will be emailed home. It is therefore important that the school has a current email address.

For families who require a second report, these reports will be printed and sent home with students unless we receive an email with confirmation of an email address for these reports.

INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN

The ACT Government has launched an Infrastructure Plan that outlines the future pipeline of ACT Government projects and priority works to address Canberra's future growth.

The Infrastructure Plan includes \$2.1 billion to build new schools and modernise existing schools.

As the fastest-growing region in the ACT, Gungahlin has been a priority in recent years. Since 2008, the ACT Government has built five new schools across the region as well as undertaking several significant school expansions.

The Molonglo region will see a new primary school in Denman Prospect opening in 2021 and planning is underway for a future 7-10 campus.

In Gungahlin, a new primary school at Throsby will accept students from the 2022 school year and a new high school at Kenny is set to open in 2023. Franklin Early Childhood School and Gold Creek School will have increased capacity.

With the Molonglo region growing and urban renewal driving growth in the Inner North and Inner South, these areas will need a new focus for school infrastructure in the coming years.

Modernisation at both Campbell Primary School and Narrabundah College will meet rising demand and create a more comfortable learning environment for students.


The ACT Government is also undertaking feasibility studies to inform future needs in the Belconnen and Woden Town Centres.

Over the last four years, the Government has invested \$180.3 million in ACT public school capital works. Here at Harrison School, we have increased capacity with additional learning spaces, upgraded classrooms, our heating, ventilation and cooling system, our telephone and security systems and installed a sensory courtyard. In addition, works are currently underway to reinstate our landscaping.

SCHOOL TRAVEL - TERM 4 2019

2020 School Travel Applications Now Open



To assist with any enquiries you may receive regarding student travel applications, we have provided some information below.

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updatedetails>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE TO SCHOOL

ALL students arriving late to school **MUST** sign in at either the main front office or the Senior Office.

IMPORTANT - STUDENT ABSENCES

If your child/ren are absent for any reason from school could you please call the school on 61422200, or email the school at Harrison.Absences@ed.act.edu.au

Please include your child's **FIRST AND LAST NAME** and **CLASS**.

REMINDER

ALL students **MUST** be signed in and out of the school by a parent or carer. If you need to add a parent/guardian to your child's contact details, please come to the front office to fill in the appropriate form.

Preschool – Yr. 6 students **MUST** be signed out from the main administration office before they are collected from class.

Years 7 – 10 students **MUST** be signed in and out by a parent or carer from the senior office.

As there is no automatic insurance cover for personal injury if your child is injured at school or during a school organised activity/excursion you should therefore consider whether taking out personal insurance cover for your child is warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for students who are injured or suddenly become ill at school or during an approved school organised activity within the ACT.

PAYMENTS TO THE SCHOOL

When sending in any payment to the school, please ensure that you complete the envelope provided with the student's name and the completed and signed permission note is placed inside the envelope. This will ensure that you receive the correct receipt from the school.
